Voters Roll Guide

How to inspect the provisional voters roll, confirm your details and lodge an objection or correction request.

1. What the voters roll is

The provisional voters roll is the official list of students who are eligible to vote in the 2026/27 TUT SRC and Student Faculty Council (SFC) elections. It is compiled from the University's registration data and contains your student number, name, faculty and campus.

Every registered student must inspect the roll and confirm that their details are correct. If your details are missing or incorrect, you may be prevented from voting or from nominating a candidate.

Why it matters

Nominations and voting are locked to the voters roll. Your student number, faculty and campus on the roll determine which SFC candidates you may nominate and where you may vote.

2. Inspection period and objections

Objections and correction requests entertained	From 24 July 2026, 12:00	Online form or elections office
Nominations open	27 July 2026, 00:00	tutsrc-elections.co.za/nominate
Nominations close	10 August 2026, 16:00	Online

Objections lodged after the closing of the inspection period cannot be considered.

3. How to inspect your details

- 1** Open the voters roll page
Go to tutsrc-elections.co.za/voters-roll from any phone or computer.
- 2** Enter your student number
Type your TUT student number exactly as it appears on your student card.
- 3** Verify with a one-time PIN (OTP)
A six-digit PIN is emailed to the address the University holds for you. Enter the PIN to prove the record belongs to you. The PIN is valid for 30 minutes.
- 4** Check your details
Confirm your full name, student number, faculty and campus.
- 5** Confirm or object
If everything is correct, confirm. If something is wrong or your record is missing, submit a correction request using the "Can't find your details?" option.

Confirmation email

Once you confirm, we email you an acknowledgement containing the details we hold for you. If everything on that email is correct, no further action is required.

4. If you cannot find your details



- Check for typing errors — the student number must be entered without spaces.
- Students who registered late may not yet appear on the provisional roll.
- Use the correction request form on the voters roll page. Supply your full name, student number, cell number, TUT email address, faculty and campus.
- Requests are reviewed by the elections office and you are notified by email of the outcome.

5. What we do with your information

Your personal information is processed strictly for the administration of the 2026/27 TUT SRC and SFC elections, in line with the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA) and the IEMSA POPIA policy published under Documents. Details are never sold, published in full, or shared with candidates or political structures.

6. Frequently asked questions

Question	Answer
I did not receive the OTP email.	Check your spam or junk folder, wait two minutes and request a new PIN. If the email address on the roll is out of date, use the correction request form.
My faculty is wrong.	Submit a correction request. Faculty determines which SFC candidates you may nominate.
My campus is wrong.	Submit a correction request. Campus determines your voting station and CSRC ballot.
Can I inspect on behalf of a friend?	No. Each student must verify their own record using their own OTP.
